Third Sunday of Lent 8th March 2015

FAMILY - CHALLENGES, OPPORTUNITIES, SUPPORT

The phrase "March of many weathers" really applied to this week of our Parish Retreat. Despite the best efforts of the elements, the spirit of prayer and praise was not dampened or put off by the sleet showers, frosty mornings and windy evenings!

As Archbishop Martin said in his talk that this is an important time for families. There are many changes happening at great speed. The values, structures and supports that we take for granted are changing and disappearing. The long term commitment of Christian Marriage is being diluted. How can we present to people that the Sacrament of Marriage is not just a point of transition of a couple in love, but is the an essential building block in the structure of society for bringing life into the world, nurturing that life and passing on the values of faith.

We should celebrate good marriages but not use them as a criticism of families who face difficulties and marriages which don't work out.

Parishes must be the places where support is given to marriage and the family. The Synod last year was to listen to the reality of family life around the world and the Synod in October is to look at suggestions and plans from around the world develop pastoral support for those preparing for marriage, those living the vocation of Marriage and to give support to people and families in crisis.

The role of Grandparents has increasing significance today as they look after their grandchildren and are also key people in handing on the gift of faith. Éanna Johnson on Tuesday spoke of the joy of being a Grandparent but also the worry about their experience of faith both at home and school. But it is the small things like dropping into a church to light a candle with grandchildren, taking time to spend with them, saying a little prayer with them. One idea the struck a chord was different gifts to celebrate birthdays and first communion/confirmation. They will always give money at birthdays but not for the sacraments, that gift should be something of faith.

On Wednesday evening Fr. John Harris O.P., spoke of the joy and honour to be involved in youth ministry over the last ten years. There are big challenges for young people who are growing up in an environment where the values and ways of faith are criticized and questioned, yet there is a great hunger to believe. All of us are capable of sharing the love of Jesus with others, that is the key to any ministry of sharing the faith. Like Pope Francis, it is the joy of our faith that will attract people of all ages, and it is the joy of faith the society is missing.

Many people have used the services of St. Luke's Hospital in Rathgar and in their time there have met Fr. Tom O'Connor, the chaplain. On Thursday he celebrated the Sacrament of the Sick and brought a great sense of the healing power of Christ's compassion to the ceremony. He spoke from his heart of the need we have to find strength and support in our time of weakness and pain. That is there for us in Jesus. He is our companion, our strength and sure support.

On Thursday evening Elma Walsh spoke of the strength of her son Donal and a sixteen year old's battle with cancer that eventually claimed his life. As she said many a young person with the illness he faced would have stayed in bed and grown angry at the disease eating away at him. But not Donal, he wanted to use the energy he had to live his life, to be with his friends, to participate in the sports he loved, and to witness to the inner strength he got from faith. She spoke of his description of Kerry "as a place you can't look around without a mountain being in front of you. This cancer is my mountain, that God has asked me to climb." And towards the end of his life he said "a door will open, anyone can find their own door. It takes a lot of courage to ask. Take time and ask....I've climbed God's mountain."

Elma spoke of how Donal's faith gave him strength. Now as she speaks to groups of young people she tells of the many around him who began to pray again, or for the first time, of going to weekly Mass. Spirituality should not be hidden from young people, they need it and we should share this with them, not hide it away. Our retreat finished on Friday night with Taizé prayer and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. In a week of

receiving so much it was good to have the time to pray together, light our candle and place the burdens and worries, the iovs and hopes of our families into the open arms of Jesus.
