N The fourth Sunday of Easter is traditionally known as Good

Shepherd Sunday. The Gospel from John chapter 10 depicts Jesus describing himself as the Good Shepherd, one who not only cares for his sheep and goes in search of the lost sheep, but is also willing to 'lay down his life for his sheep'. If this image describes how Jesus sees his relationship with the community of his disciples and his role in making the kingdom of God a living reality, then it also says something about our role as his disciples today. Traditionally we have referred to this as Vocations Sunday and made a special appeal for vocations to the priesthood and to religious life. Today, however, we place increasing emphasis on the vocation of all Christians, that is rooted in our baptism, hence the emergence in recent years of the ministries of parish pastoral worker and catechist. Through the new diocesan office of Ministry and Mission, the diocese provides training at partnership and deanery level in servant leadership as well as ongoing support for baptism and funeral teams, ministers of the Word and of the Eucharist. This year, six members from our partnership (five from this parish) have just completed an excellent new course in catechesis run by the office of Mission and


