When we look at the family of Joseph and Mary of Nazareth, this family highlights certain qualities. Among many of those I would like to look closely at one quality - that is generosity. Firstly the generosity of the Father Almighty in

His revelation through the Incarnation of His only Son. Secondly, generous acceptance of the Word of God and the total submission to the same by our Holy Mother. Lastly the generous love and mercy St. Joseph had to his wife Mary and to God's Son "Jesus." Pope Francis, says "Jesus was born into a family. He could have come in a spectacular way, either as a warrior, or as an emperor" but Jesus chose to enter this world through the love of a family.
