The experience of being part of a family is something fabulous, no matter what is the size, shape or duration of the time, but everyone has got one's own part to make the family a special one. The Christian family is a space, where the young grow to maturity as Jesus did in Nazareth. The family is where we learn the basics of life, where we are loved and taught to love and care for those around us. We get our emotional security from being loved unconditionally by our family and it is a sense of belonging, a sense of deep intimacy and a sense of companionship.

As we celebrate the feast of Holy Family they put before us a lot of lessons to learn. They led a normal life and treated Jesus as any parents would treat a child in those times. Everything was not fine in their life, because they lived in the deep shadow of the cross. At a very early stage Mary and Joseph were migrants with a young baby, they were refugees seeking shelter in a foreign land with only the clothes they stood in. They were lost, lonely, terrified and afraid.

When we look at the family of Joseph and Mary of Nazareth, this family highlights certain qualities. Among many of those I would like to look closely at one quality - **that is generosity**. Firstly the generosity of the Father Almighty in His revelation through the Incarnation of His only Son. Secondly, generous acceptance of the Word of God and the total submission to the same by our Holy Mother. Lastly the generous love and mercy St. Joseph had to his wife Mary and to God's Son "Jesus." Pope Francis, says "Jesus was born into a family. He could have come in a spectacular way, either as a warrior, or as an emperor" but Jesus chose to enter this world through the love of a family. So let us pray for all our families especially those families that are facing difficulties of any kind. And let us strengthen families and the institution of
