The Liturgical Year climaxes this Friday with the feast of Christ the King. Our whole liturgical year which begins with a season of Old Testament expectation and eschatological (end of time) hope (Advent), celebrates the birth of Jesus (Christmas), remembers his passion and death (Lent and Holy Week), celebrates his resurrection and sending of the Holy Spirit (Easter and Pentecost) and lives out these mysteries in the daily life and mission of the Church (Ordinary time), culminates with our proclamation of Christ as King: the centre and goal of our lives. Although the liturgical cycle is the same each year, we experience it differently each time, both because the readings at Mass follow a three year Sunday and two year

weekday cycle, and because we are in a different place in our own life and faith journey. Our efforts to know, love and follow Christ are ever new, inspired by his grace already at work in our lives, and encouraged by our prayer with and for one another and for all of God's people. This is what it means to be Church: continually receiving and reaching out.

This Friday 21st November, we celebrate our annual Mass for those from the parish who died in the past year. Many, though not all, of the funerals took place in our church. This annual Mass of remembrance has become a very important event in our calendar, as we light a candle in memory of each of those who have died and reach out in support to their families and loved ones. Families will often say that the days around the funeral of a loved one pass in a blur of shock and numbness, and it is only months later that the reality of their loss sinks in. The annual Mass in November is
