Pope Francis invites us to find "ways to mark this Sunday with a certain Solemnity" (Aperuit illis 3).

Some ideas to think about:

- Take out your family bible and choose a passage to read
- Make some time each day to read the bible.
- Choose an Old Testament Book and One of the Gospels to read between now and the end of February.
- Think about joining a scripture group or Lectio Divina group.
- Make a list of your favourite stories or passages from the bible.
- Download a children's version of a Bible story and read it to your children or grandchildren.
- Download a colouring picture of a Bible story for your children or grandchildren.

The Sunday of the Word of God

The third Sunday of Ordinary Time is now **"The Sunday of the Word of God"** as established by Pope Francis.

'Through the proclaimed biblical readings in the liturgy, God speaks to his people and Christ himself proclaims his Gospel; Christ is the centre and fullness of all Scripture, both the Old and New Testaments. Listening to the Gospel, the high point of the Liturgy of the Word, is characterised by a special veneration, expressed not only by gestures and acclamations, but by the Book of the Gospels itself.'

Pope Francis wanted "a Sunday given over entirely to the Word of God, so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people" (*Misericordia e misera*, 7). It takes place during the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, emphasising the important bond we have in Sacred Scripture with other Christian denominations and religious traditions.

Pope Francis' Prayer to Mary Woman of Listening

Mary, woman of listening,
open our ears;
grant us to know how to listen to the word of your Son Jesus
among the thousands of words of this world;
grant that we may listen to the reality in which we live, to every
person we encounter,
especially those who are poor, in need, in hardship. Mary,
woman of decision,
illuminate our mind and our heart,
so that we may obey, unhesitating, the word of your Son Jesus;
give us the courage to decide,
not to let ourselves be dragged along, letting others direct our
life. Mary, woman of action,
obtain that our hands and feet move "with haste" toward others,
to bring them the charity and love of your Son Jesus,
to bring the light of the Gospel to the world,
as you did.


CHRISTMAS DUES
