

### CHRISTMAS MESSAGE

I would like to wish you and your family a very happy Christmas and every blessing as the New Year begins. It is always a lovely time of the year when family and friends get together and celebrate the birth of Jesus. Our families come in all shapes and sizes and in August next year we will celebrate the gift of family as Pope Francis joins us for the World Meeting of Families.

At this time of the year we think about God becoming one of us. The only way that he could do this was through a family. For the Holy Family it was not an easy beginning. Earlier this year I visited Greccio where the first crib was created by St. Francis. He wanted to help us see the simple beginning of Jesus' life, but the crib there goes on to show the other events that immediately followed the birth, the visit of shepherds and kings, the slaughter of innocents and the escape into Egypt.

In our world where we continue to face homelessness and the tragedy of people dying on our streets, where the future all around us seems so uncertain, the fact that God has come into our lives gives us hope.

Because in the words of Bl. Oscar Romero "Christmas should awaken us to the reality that the face of Christ is in each person we greet, each friend with whom we shake hands, each beggar that asks for bread, each worker who ask for the right to organize and each campesino who goes looking for work at coffee-harvest time. If the person before us is Christ, how could we rob them of their rights? Everything that we do to this person before us, Christ will take as done to him. This is the meaning of Christmas – that Christ lives among us."

In the new year we begin soon, let us recognize the face of Christ in our family, friends, strangers and those who reach out to us. With every blessing, Fr. Paul

#### **Brackenstown Bible Study 2018**

In January 2017 we studied the very informative 23 week Scripture Study course "The Bible Timeline; The Story of Salvation" This is the foundational study in The Great Adventure Bible Study Series that has helped hundreds of thousands of Catholics learn to read the Bible.



During 2018 we will study Matthew: The King and His Kingdom, a Catholic Bible study that brings the history of Christ to life through St. Matthew's Gospel. You will see Jesus as the awaited Messiah who fulfills the promises and prophecies of the Old Testament, establishes the New Law, and inaugurates the Kingdom of Heaven. The study runs for a total of 24 weeks, there will be 14 classes in Spring 2018 and 10 classes in Autumn 2018. ## World Meeting of Families Icon



## Introduction to the Icon of the Holy Family

Pope Francis encourages families to look at or 'gaze' at the icon of the Holy Family. Why? The word 'icon' means an image. But it is more than a picture or photograph. When we read the bible with reverence we are not just reading words, we are already praying. It is the same with an icon. When we look on it with reverence - when we 'gaze' on it - we are praying. God is speaking to us through the images and we are responding.

If you would like your family to spend a little time with the icon here are three simple steps.

1. When you get home from Christmas Mass or at another moment that suits gather the family for a few minutes.

- 2. Pass around the icon and offer the explanation (below).
- 3. After you have finished this ask one family member to read the family prayer with the icon.

#### **Explanation of the Holy Family Icon**

**The angels on the outside** - This icon of the Holy Family is shaped a bit like a house with a double door. On the outside of each door there is an angel. Michael on the left, Gabriel on the right. We remember the prayer from our childhood. 'O angel of God, my guardian dear.' Angels represent God's desire to protect us, our home and our family. When we pray to the angels we pray for God's protection. The words at the bottom of the door mean 'The Joy of Love' - the message to us from Pope Francis about family.





**The Holy Family at the centre** - When we open up the doors we see in the centre the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph gathered around the table. They are sharing a meal and celebrating the Passover, a Jewish religious festival remembering God's goodness. Like all families they had experiences of joys and sorrows. They were once refugees in another country, fleeing the violence of King Herod. This image of the Holy Family is very similar in form to another icon - one of the Blessed Trinity. This reminds us that God is like a family, and that family is the place where the love of God is experienced through the love we have for one another.



**Family stories from the gospels at either side** - On either side of the Holy Family there are images from the Gospels, showing Jesus' care for marriage and his deep compassion for those living with the burdens of family life. The image on the left depicts a story from the gospel of St Mark. Jesus brings back to life the daughter of a man called Jarius. The image on the right is from the wedding feast at Cana, a story from St. John's gospel. Here Jesus reaches out to the newly married couple in a moment of need.



#### **Our Family New Year's Resolutions for 2018**

**On New Year's Eve or New Year's Day** why not take an opportunity to look back together on the year gone by and look forward to the year ahead.

Here are five easy steps for having a family chat that can result in up to three New Year's resolution that the whole family can commit to for the year ahead. Use this moment to foster communications and make decisions that build family life. Gather the family around the table or any place where you can talk to each other. One person leads the conversation by asking the questions below - give about 5-6 minutes to each question. Ensure every person in the family has a chance to speak.

#### STEP 1 - Looking back on 2017 - is there a family moment that I remember?

- A fun moment...
- A lovely moment...
- A sad moment...
- A moment I'll never forget!..

#### STEP 2 - Looking forward to 2018 - what would I love for us as a family?

• Something we might do...

• Something we might stop doing...

#### STEP 3 - Is there anything in what Pope Francis says here about families that strikes me?

"Always remember to say please, thanks and sorry - doing this in the good times helps in the bad times"

"If anyone has a success let's all celebrate - if anyone is in trouble let's all help"

"We all need our own space - let's respect that for each other"

"Practice forgiving - let's be slow to judge one another"

"Listen to one another's stories especially across the generations"

"The family that prays together stays together"

#### STEP 4 - In light of what we have all chatted about is there one resolution I'd love us to make for the coming year?

- Can we make our suggestions?
- Can we list these?

### STEP 5 - From all we have heard which resolutions can we all sign up to?

- Can we write these up in simple, concrete language on our family New Year's Resolutions sheet?

### Some of the criteria for applicants to become a volunteer:

- Be a resident of the island of Ireland at the time of application.
- Be over 18 years of age as of 1st January 2018; or between the ages of 16 & 18 if volunteering in a group with ratio of at least one adult to ten young people. (There is no upper age limit.)
- Be sensitive and respectful of our Catholic ethos.
- Be fluent in English all training and management instructions will be in English.
- Be aware we will supply you with a volunteer uniform that you may keep as a souvenir.
- Be aware you will be given a lunch pack during your volunteering shifts.
- Must apply for Garda vetting as part of the application process in line with the procedure laid down.
- Be available to volunteer for a minimum of four (4) consecutive days between 18th and 29th August 2018. (Shifts will last up to 8 hours and you will be given adequate rest time).
- Be available for three mandatory training sessions which will be on Saturdays and will last 3 to 5 hours. They will cover Induction, Job and Venue Specific Training. Advance notice will be given of dates.
- Be able to provide the names and contact details for two referees in a position to give a character reference.




#### EUCHARISTIC ADORATION
