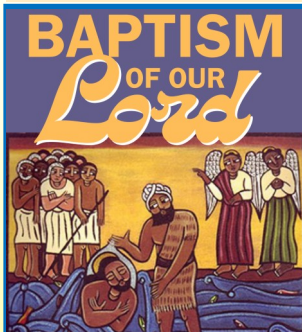
SECOND SUNDAY OF CHRISTMAS 3rd JANUARY 2026 - YEAR A



Our Christmas season concludes in the coming week with the feast of Epiphany (6th January) and the feast of the Baptism of our Lord (Sunday 11th January). Known as Little Christmas or Nollaig na mBan, Epiphany celebrates the arrival of the magi or wise men from the east. It highlights the idea that the revelation of Christ is not for people of Jewish faith alone (such as the apostles) but is intended for all humanity. This insight will lead St. Paul to become the great apostle to the gentiles (or pagans). It marks a radical development in the life of the early Church, leading to the first Church Council, the Council of Jerusalem, at which the apostles endorse Paul and Barnabas's mission to the gentiles at Antioch, which will become one of the five great centres of Christianity. Our Epiphany is also the time at which many of the eastern churches celebrate the Nativity of Our Lord, so

we wish them a happy Christmas. The feast of the Baptism of Our Lord marks the liturgical transition to Ordinary Time and propels us forward to the beginning of Jesus' public ministry, which follows his baptism by John. It also introduces us to John, whose role is to encourage people to prepare a way for Christ. As we will hear in the coming weeks, the arrest of John is the key for Jesus to leave his hidden life at Nazareth and begin to proclaim the coming of the kingdom of God (a central theme in Matthew's Gospel). His ministry will be characterised by the calling of disciples and by encounters with people which bring healing. For Matthew, this is not simply history. What he is describing is the shape discipleship and Christian ministry should take today. At a time when people make resolutions for the coming year, perhaps the most significant resolution we could make is to renew our faith in the one whose birth we have just celebrated, so that it becomes a key driving force in our lives. If our faith has weakened through neglect in recent times, then maybe today can be the first step forward in starting anew. God believes in us far more than we believe in him!

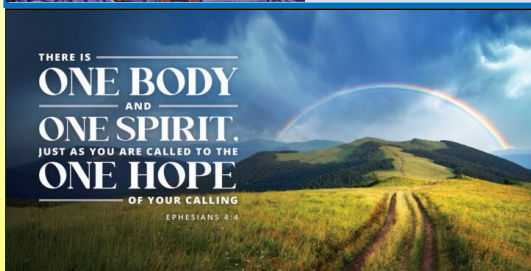
