This is the mystery of Divine Mercy Sunday. Christ who gave his own life for the world, redeems us from our sins, and desires that every soul should come to know the depths of this love. His death and resurrection, including appearing to his disciples, is the means by which Christ has revealed the love of the Father.

Pope Francis recently said at a general audience, "Where does our mercy come from? Jesus told us: 'Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful' (Lk 6:36). The more one welcomes the Father's love, the more we can love." To pour forth mercy is to participate in the revelation of the Father's love. This is what the rays of red and white on the image of the Merciful Jesus revealed to St. Faustina show. The love which pours forth from Christ's heart is mercy! It is the love of the Father spilled out!

John Paul II, the great apostle of Divine Mercy, once wrote, "The truth, revealed in Christ, about God the 'Father of mercies,' enables us to 'see' Him as particularly close to man especially when man is suffering, when he is under threat at the very heart of his existence and dignity." When there is suffering, Christ can bring calm. In those moments the power of the Gospel will be made known. Christ will rush in and flood weary hearts with his peace.

Today on Divine Mercy Sunday, we continue to rejoice in the course of our Easter celebrations. Mercy is not one aspect of the Gospel of Jesus; Mercy is its very centre.

Information note on Fingal's Community Response Forum

The Fingal Covid-19 Community Response Forum has been established for the past week to tackle the COVID-19 emergency and is being co-ordinated by Fingal County Council. The Community Response Helpline, which is operated by Fingal County Council's Customer Care Unit seven days a week 8am to 8pm, has been set up so that the more vulnerable members of our Fingal community who may be cocooning at this time, can seek assistance and help during this crisis.

The role of the Forum is to ensure that there is a co-ordinated community response and to enable all voluntary statutory agencies to collaborate in support of our communities and particularly the most vulnerable members.

The dedicated helpline is to assist at risk members of the public in accessing non-emergency and non-medical supports and advice during the current public health emergency such as the collection and delivery of food, prescriptions and other medical supplies as well as the delivery of cooked meals. The Forum has also organised with ALONE so those who may have been isolated from other social contacts have someone who they can speak to.

We encourage people who need assistance in having groceries, prescriptions or hot meals delivered or those who are simply looking for someone to talk to during this crisis.


