Ordinary Time St. Luke's Gospel



"Go and do the same yourself'

You may have seen this poster on the road outside the church near the flagpoles. This is the poster for Ordinary Time, which we celebrate from now until the end of November. What makes this poster unique for this year is the image of the winged ox and the quote from the Good Samarian which only appears in Luke's

This is the fourth poster since Ash Wednesday. The poster for lent was purple, the Holy Week one was mixture of red and white. Red for Palm Sunday and Good Friday and white for Holy Thursday and Easter Sunday. Then we had the Easter Poster for the 50 days of Easter. Now we have the green for Ordinary Time. We are used to having these liturgical colours on the banners and vestments and Altar cloths inside the church, so these posters are a way of letting us know when passing the church what liturgical season we are in.

The main image in this poster is a winged ox which represents Luke. This image of the Winged Ox symbolises Sacrifice, Service and Strength in Luke's Gospel. That may seem very strange, however there is a winged animal for each of the four Evangelists, these symbolic representations are from visions in Ezekiel (1:10) and Revelation(4:7). You may see these images in some churches, eg in Holy Child

Whitehall the four winged animals are in the four corners of the high ceiling over the sanctuary.

Between now and November we will read Luke's gospel in a semi continuous way each Sunday. Last week we heard in chapter 10 the inspiring parable of The Good Samaritan. Today we continue in chapter 10 where we hear about Martha and Mary. Next Sunday the gospel will be from chapter 11 which includes the Our Father. The following week we hear from chapter 12 where amongst other stories is the parable of the rich man. It's a bit like watching a series or doing a jigsaw, when it all comes together you get the full picture.

I hope this poster helps to remind us to put into action the Gospel of Luke, that like the symbolism of the ox we will be people of Sacrifice, Service and Strength who can put into action the words of Jesus:

"Go and do the same yourself"

Students from Loreto College thank the parishioners of St Cronan's Church for supporting their Church Gate Collection last weekend. The amount raised was €1,733.00.




