The right *relationship* won' distractuo

In the middle ages they used to put people guilty of some petty crime in the stocks, while others filed up to throw rotten fruit or vegetables at them. Today, people sometimes use social media to discredit the reputation of someone else. It amounts to the same thing. No one likes to be the butt of someone else's joke, and yet we can do it to others all the time. This is the plight of the prophet Jeremiah in this Sunday's First Reading: the ignominy of

being lowered into a well where he sinks in the mud is worse than any physical punishment. When you become a figure of ridicule in the eyes of others, it is hard for people to take your message seriously. And what is Jeremiah's crime? His words 'dishearten' the soldiers and the people. We have a tendency to listen to those who tell us what we want to hear, rather than what we need to hear, to those who reinforce our way of life rather than question whether our current western way of life is either just or sustainable. The role of the prophet in any society is to speak truth, however unpalatable. As people of faith, we rightly focus on the compassion of Christ, particularly towards those who are struggling or in any kind of need. We tend to pray when we want something, but the God of Jesus Christ is not just there when we need him. Jesus came to call us back to right relationship with God, with other people and with the whole of creation. Sometimes the implications of that call can make uncomfortable hearing: 'I have come to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were blazing already!' Fr. Richard

As the threat to health posed by Covid infection has been significantly reduced in recent months due to the high level of vaccination in the community, we feel that it is now timely to ease some of the restrictions that were introduced following the return to the public celebration of Mass after lockdown.

From the weekend of Saturday/Sunday 3rd/4th September, Ministers of the Eucharist will no longer bring Holy Communion to the congregation in the pews. Instead, those who wish to receive will be invited to come forward to receive Communion at the steps of the altar as they would have done prior to Covid.

Children or adults who wish to receive a blessing are also welcome to come forward.
