FEAST OF THE ASCENSION

12TH MAY 2024



We are invited to join with every parish in the diocese in a Novena to the Holy Spirit – a dedicated period of prayer, reflection and planning for the renewal of the Church in the Archdiocese of Dublin. The nine day period of prayer begins this Sunday, 12th May, Feast of the Ascension of the Lord, and runs through Pentecost, continuing to the Feast of Mary, Mother of the Church on Friday 20th May. Pentecost, which we will celebrate next Sunday, marks the beginning of the Church and the start of its mission. The Novena to the Holy Spirit is part of the Building Hope pastoral renewal process of prayerful listening, dialogue, planning and action. Recalling the example of the disciples after the Ascension, who persevered together in prayer with Mary, the Mother of Jesus, awaiting the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, we are warmly encouraged to join in prayer here at Mass or to

pray **BUILDING HOPE** PRAYER daily in

our home over the next nine days. A booklet containing a prayer and reflection for each of the nine days is available at the back of the church and will be used at daily and Sunday Mass. Children from 2nd class in Swords and Thornleigh Ed. Together and Broadmeadows C.N. schools will celebrate the sacrament of **First Communion** at 10am, while those attending Gaelscoil Bhrian Boroimhe School will celebrate First Communion at 12noon, **next Saturday 18**th **May.**

Many thousands of people across the country and abroad are participating this weekend in the annual **Darkness into Light** walk, including in Swords (River Valley), Donabate and Malahide. It is a wonderful expression of solidarity with those who are affected by or are close to someone who suffers with mental health issues. There are people in every community, including our own, who are affected by depression, anxiety or a sense of isolation.

The purpose of a faith community is to affirm hope, no matter how dark a situation may seem, and to remind one another that we are never alone. Some helpful resources in relation to supports that are available locally have been left around the church.

Our parish partnership is planning a **Pilgrimage to Lourdes** from Sunday 15th-Thursday 19th September. The cost of the pilgrimage for four nights and five days (inclusive of flights, accommodation and full board) is €735 per person sharing.

A limited number of single rooms are available, and the single supplement is €40 per night. Booking forms are available at the parish office. As the pilgrimage is nearly half full at this stage, we are putting a provisional deadline for bookings or expressions of interest of Friday 31st May.

A half day of recollection for Ministers of the Word and of the Eucharist in the parishes of Swords, River Valley, Donabate and Brackenstown parishes is planned for Saturday June 22nd in Brackenstown Pastoral Centre from 10am to 1pm. This will be led by Peter Siney from the Office of Mission and Ministry. Please indicate to the parish office if you wish to attend.
