The Synod on Communion, Participation and Mission, which has taken place in Rome throughout the month of October and has brought together bishops, lay men and women, priests and members of religious congregations, enters its final week of discussions and discernment. It is merely the first part of a Synod which will reassemble in Rome in October 2024. As parishioners who are following the Synod reports online are aware, and as this week's newsletter indicates, much of the discussion has been around the role of women in the Church and the theme of co-responsibility. Perhaps even more important than what emerges from the Synod is the way the Synod has been conducted and the inclusion of lay women and men in the process, which must mark the way forward for future Synods. This week's newsletter, distributed by the Diocesan Synodal Committee, is available at the church entrances.

Much of our attention this week, as well as our thoughts and prayers, has been focussed on the situation in Israel/Palestine. As more details come to light, the scale of the atrocity committed on hundreds of innocent Israeli citizens is truly horrifying. We can only imagine the anxiety of the families of those who have been kidnapped and join them in praying for their safe release. But what is taking place in the Gaza strip is equally appalling, with many people already killed or injured, thousands of others driven from

their homes and threatened with hunger, disease and lack of access to medicines. We can only pray that the situation does not escalate, that the violence cease and that a humanitarian corridor be created to allow vital supplies to reach those who are suffering. In war, no one wins, and everyone suffers.

Open our eyes and our hearts, and give us the courage to say: 'Never again war!' With war everything is lost. Instil in our hearts the courage to take concrete steps to achieve peace.

Lord, God of Abraham, God of the prophets, God of love, You created us and you call us to live as brothers and sisters. Give us the strength daily to be instruments of peace. Enable us to see everyone who crosses our path as our brother and sister.
