The Building Hope Prayer

Pilgrim God, we give you thanks and praise. You constantly journey with us even in our darkness and doubts.

As parishioners are aware, we are engaged with the diocesan Building Hope initiative and are currently in Year 1 of a three year implementation plan 2025-2027. Following parish consultation across the whole diocese a few years ago, four key pillars emerged as central to the Building Hope Initiative of developing parishes which are vibrant and faith filled: Welcome and Inclusion, Faith, Servant Leadership and Social Justice. Together with the other parishes in our partnership (Swords and Drynam, River Valley, Donabate and Portrane), we have agreed to address one of these pillars each month at weekend Mass and to seek the wisdom of parishioners through a questionnaire as to how we might progress each of these areas in our parish. In July we focussed on 'Welcome and Inclusion'; in August we looked at 'Faith'. This Sunday after Communion, a member of our Parish Pastoral Council will give a

brief summary of the feedback from last month's questionnaire on Faith. Next weekend, 20th/21st September, members of our PPC will address the pillar for this month: 'Servant Leadership', which reminds us, following Christ's example of washing the feet of the disciples at the Last Supper, that, for Christians, leadership is always connected with service. Finally, in October, we will address the fourth pillar, 'Social Justice'. We appreciate the huge response of parishioners to the questionnaires, which will help us discern what will enable us to move forward to build the Church of the future, a Church which is active and continually reaching out to serve the needs of the community. We plan to put up a display at the back of the church, so that parishioners can read the summary of each of the consultations so far.
