**'Habemas Papam!'.** With these joyous words, the Cardinal Protodeacon announced the news of the election of Pope Leo XIV on Thursday evening. The white smoke billowing from the chimney above the Sistine Chapel on just the second day of the Papal Conclave took everyone by surprise, as did the announcement that the new pontiff would be American-born Cardinal Robert Prevost. Rather like the announcement of the election of his predecessor, the first reaction from most onlookers seemed to be: 'who is he?' Like Pope Francis, he is a member of a religious congregation and his heart is actually in South America, in Peru where he has ministered across several decades as an Augustinian missionary, and more recently as Bishop of Chiclayo. In between he served a twelve year term as Prior General of the Augustinians. By adopting the name Leo XIV, he is making a deliberate link to Pope Leo XIII, who in 1891 published the first of several encyclicals highlighting the



social dimension of the Gospel, Rerum Novarum, and to his own concern for the poor, among whom he ministered in Peru. In his opening greeting the new Pontiff echoed Christ's Easter gift of peace, embracing people everywhere and 'the whole earth', calling for unity and the building of bridges through encounter and dialogue. It is also sounds a positive note that he wishes to build on the process of Synodality, started by Pope Francis, whereby Catholics, lay and clerical, collaborate in decision making through a process of mutual listening and discernment. It is very appropriate that the first Sunday following his election is Good Shepherd Sunday, so we ask God to bless our new shepherd as he takes up the task of leading the Church universal in the coming years. May the Holy Spirit guide the Church and Pope Leo in this new beginning!

# The Bible and the Church Fathers course continues this Monday 12<sup>th</sup> May

Next Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> May, is Lay Ministry Sunday. As we celebrate the increasing role parishioners take in ministering to others in our parishes, the annual Lay Ministry Appeal takes place at each Mass across the diocese. The appeal replaces the usual Share Collection and funds the excellent training the Office for Mission and Ministry provides for parish funeral and baptism teams and catechists and also Parish Pastoral Workers. Your support is greatly appreciated.

The newly established **Dublin Diocesan Pastoral Council** will be formally commissioned at the 11.00am Mass at the Pro-Cathedral next Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> May. In the spirit of the Universal Synod on Synodality, a process of selection was designed that allowed for widespread invitation, prayerful discernment and practical application. In December 2024, the 15 Deaneries, made up of Parish Pastoral Council representatives, religious and clergy, were invited to put forward candidates whom they felt would have the necessary gifts to serve on the DDPC. A four-stage process of discernment then followed at Deanery, Pastoral Area, and finally Diocesan levels. At each stage the groups entrusted with the discernment were made up of both laity and clergy. The members of the Diocesan Pastoral Council will serve a three year term and will offer advice to the Archbishop on areas of pastoral concern. As we pray for them, as they prepare to take up this new responsibility, we also thank those parishioners who had the generosity to allow their names to go forward for consideration.
