




Acolyte and Permanent Diaconate

The role of an Acolyte is to assist the Priest or Deacon with their Liturgical duties. It is a role more associated with Altar Servers these days, but in the preparation for Priesthood and the Permanent Diaconate it serves to highlight the liturgical ministry.

Declan Colgan is in his final stages of preparation for the Permanent Diaconate. The role of a Permanent Deacon is a distinct ministry of service, exercised with the Bishop and Priests of the Diocese. There are three main aspects of the ministry *Altar*, *Word and Service*. At the **Altar** they assist the Priest, bring communion to the sick, celebrate Baptism, celebrate Marriages and look after the Funeral Rites. In the **Word** they proclaim the Gospel, deliver the Homily and help in the formation of readers. To **Serve** they visit the sick, housebound, those in prison, participate in the pastoral outreach in a Parish. In the coming weeks you will see Declan take on liturgical roles. He will be wearing an alb as he assists at the Altar and distributes Holy Communion. He will lead prayer and discussion sessions and take a more active part in the ministry of the Parish. Keep him in your prayers as he continues his formation. *Fr. Paul*


