This weekend we prepare to celebrate our patron saint and national holiday, a typically Irish way of integrating the sacred and the secular, Church and state. As our politicians fly off to various parts of the globe to engage with our 'diaspora', Irish communities, we prepare for St. Patrick's Day celebrations, not just in every town in Ireland, but in every corner of the world. On a day when people everywhere like to lay claim to an Irish connection, it is also an opportunity for Irish diplomacy to exert its influence on the global stage, particularly important at a time of political uncertainty and tension. It never ceases to amaze how the national holiday of a small country on the western fringe of Europe can capture the imagination of people way beyond its borders. As well as an indication of successive generations of Irish who have emigrated, it is in no small



part a tribute to the Irish missionaries who have brought the Good News to many countries and who have contributed over many decades to the development of those societies.

This year, our national holiday invites reflection on how Ireland can use its military neutrality to greater effect, amid increasing pressure to join a military alliance. At a deeper level, the celebration of St. Patrick invites us to reflect on what it means to be Irish today. What is unique about being Irish? What do we stand for? What are our values? How do we nurture them, so that we can encourage them in future generations? For many centuries, Ireland was identified with its Christian faith. What role does faith play in Irish life today? At a time when people seem to believe that they can live reasonably contentedly without God, how do we show that belief in God makes all the difference to who we are, how we live and how the future may unfold?
