My Dear People,

Next weekend the Annual Collection to support the work of *Crosscare* with vulnerable adults takes place and replaces the Share Collection at all Masses.

Crosscare is the social support agency of the Archdiocese of Dublin and sets out to address the harsh consequences of poverty and disadvantage. For more than 75 years now *Crosscare* has mirrored the loving kindness of Jesus Christ by providing food, accommodation, information, education and support to those who are most in need.

We are all aware of the crisis of homelessness and poverty that persists across our Diocese. This time last year, *Crosscare* had just opened its new family service in the former Mater Dei premises. In addition to offering dignified temporary accommodation for homeless families, since it's doors opened the new service has sourced over 80 families with more permanent accommodation suitable for their needs. This is a great example of how your support helps *Crosscare* achieve real results for vulnerable adults, children and families.

Your continued generosity enables *Crosscare* develop new ways of working with vulnerable adults and provide support services across our parishes that will help build a better future for all.

On behalf of the staff, volunteers and vulnerable adults in *Crosscare*, I would like to thank you for your generous support over the years. I know that all who work at *Crosscare* take their work and responsibility very seriously and I urge you to support them once again in this appeal.

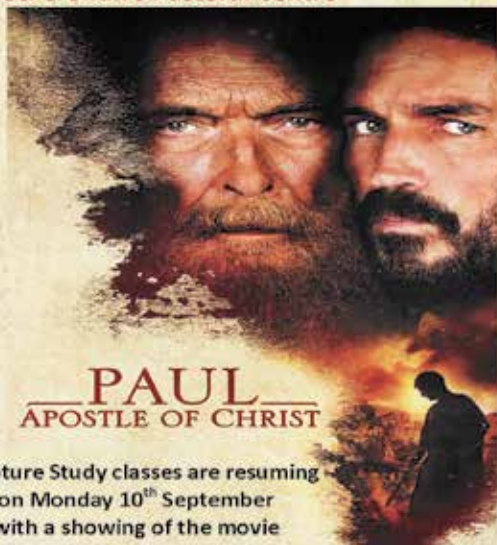

Church Refurbishment Update

The painting of the Church will resume on Thursday 13th September. Between now and then a new door into the storage area in the front porch and a rail for the schools to hang their artwork for Sacraments will be installed. The new signs and noticeboards will be put in place outside the Church. The notice boards inside the main porch will be removed and notices for the new noticeboards have to be handed in to the Parish Office. There will be a further consultation on the following:

- The permanent placement of our copy of the Icon from the World Meeting of Families. We can create a shrine where the family tree was at the back of the Church or we can put it in the Glasmere Abbey Room in the Pastoral Centre.
- The creation of a shrine at the picture of Matt Talbot to pray for his Beatification and also to pray for people with addictions.
- The organization of the Sanctuary furniture ie: the Ambo (Table of the Word) has been moved to allow a clearer view of the Tabernacle and also to keep the reverence towards the Tabernacle when people are waiting to read at Masses. The Chair being on that side of the Sanctuary allows greater respect for where the Tabernacle is placed.
- In the General Instruction to the Roman Missal there is no direction as to which side the Ambo should be placed. What it does emphasize is that the Table of the Word and the Table of the Eucharist should be simply decorated so as not to take away from the integrity of what happens in these two spaces. The Tabernacle should be placed where due reverence and respect is shown.
- But the placement of the Ambo and Chair remains a local decision on which you will be consulted.

It is planned that the new Sanctuary Furniture will be in place for the First Sunday of Advent.

Turning Faith

Into Action

Our biggest obstacle to a revival of faith in Ireland today is the system of parish life we have grown up in. This is not a model that has ever invited most Mass-goers into a serious mode of participation.

Turning faith into action is what it means to be a missionary disciple. Many people can be put off by the phrase "missionary disciple". Part of this has to do with the language – which can seem alien in a Catholic environment – but it's also partly



that most people have never been asked to talk about it. Often, when you ask someone to discuss how they live out their faith in the small, everyday ways, you will find that they are already living as a missionary disciple.

I have been struck recently by a number of parishes who really wanted to see where they were going as a parish. These groups invited along parishioners to be part of the process. When this group gets together, invariably the question asked is "why

doesn't the parish council do this?" The truth is that parish councils would not usually be in the headspace for this kind of work and so these groups have to bypass the council. You can see how, in these instances, there is a problem with communication and vision. But the very fact that there are parishes out there who are thinking outside the box and trying to engage parishioners in the process of moving into mission gives me great hope for the Irish parish of tomorrow.
