

All of these help us to really mark the new life of Easter. However we are conscious of our brothers and sisters in Ukraine who continue to suffer under the invasion of Russia into their country. The images have been harrowing and suffering tragic. We must redouble our efforts to pray and work for peace. On Good Friday in the Colosseum, Pope Francis prayed the Stations of the Cross and invited people from Ukraine and Russia to pray together. We ask through the intercession of our Blessed Mother Mary that peace will come and come soon.

Over the past two year we have changed and adapted our lives in so many ways. As we begin the Easter Season, Archbishop Farrell is beginning a process of renewal that the Diocesan Task Force identified as needing to happen to build strong faith communities throughout the Dublin Diocese. The Task Force was called "Building Hope" and this is the first stage in that construction. All of the 197 Parishes in the Diocese will look at their strengths and weaknesses, the place in which they live and who are the best partner parishes for them to link with. It is a process that all of us are being asked to get involved in and shortly after Easter our Building Hope Group in Brackenstown will begin this work.

As the banner above the Tabernacle says "We stand before you Holy Spirit" and it is only with the guidance of the Holy Spirit that we will remain focussed on the hope that will renew and strengthen our Parish and Diocese to meet the needs of our time.

On behalf of Fr. Bibin, Niamh and Deacon Declan we wish you and your families every blessing and joy this Easter. We pray that the hope that we celebrate lifts your lives towards the life that we receive through the resurrection of Jesus.
