I myself will gather the remnant of my flock from all the lands to which I have driven them and bring them back to their meadow; there they shall increase and multiply



When I was a seminarian, the Sunday which followed Good Shepherd (Vocations) Sunday was known as Clonliffe Sunday. The second collection at every Mass in the diocese was for the support of the training of priests, and it was usually the first occasion on which we students were invited to preach at a public Mass. I was dispatched to the parish of Leixlip, and I remember the parish priest at the time receiving me very graciously but insisting on looking over my homily notes in advance to check for any heresy!

As a reflection of changing times, we know it today as **Lay Ministry Sunday**, an opportunity to celebrate the gift of Baptism, which is the foundational sacrament for

all ministry in the Church. We are fortunate to belong to a parish where there is a strong tradition of people volunteering to participate in ministry. It's not about 'helping Father' but parishioners taking ownership of their baptismal calling and using their gifts in the service of the Gospel and of the wider community. Of course, ongoing training and reflection is vital to effective and fulfilling ministry, and the diocesan office for Ministry and Mission has provided some excellent programmes in the past year or two to support the development of lay ministry. Seven of our parishioners have completed the new one year Certificate in Catechesis over the past two years, four members of our Funeral Ministry Team have completed training as Lay Funeral Leaders, and our Baptism team have recently participated in training in the new diocesan programme for Baptism and are already using it in our baptism preparation.

Lay ministry is not the preserve of the few; it is the call of every baptised person. Lay Ministry Sunday invites each of us to reflect on whether we might be willing to become a minister of the Word or of the Eucharist, a member of the Baptism or Funeral Ministry teams, choir or Family Mass group, or Vincent de Paul Society. Our instinctive reaction might be: 'I am not worthy to do that...' Well, join the club! None of us are worthy, but that doesn't stop the Holy Spirit calling us and asking us to place our gifts and our inadequacy at the service of God's kingdom. Please enquire at the parish office or have a word with Fr. Richard, Fr. Joseph, Deacon Declan, or a member of our parish pastoral council if you would be interested in taking on a more active role in the parish.

The diocese is hosting an information evening for both the one-year Catechists' course and the two-year Pathways programme, each of which offers excellent preparation for ministry in the parish and in the partnership on Monday 26th May at 7.30pm in St. Paul's, Arran Quay. Well worth going along!
