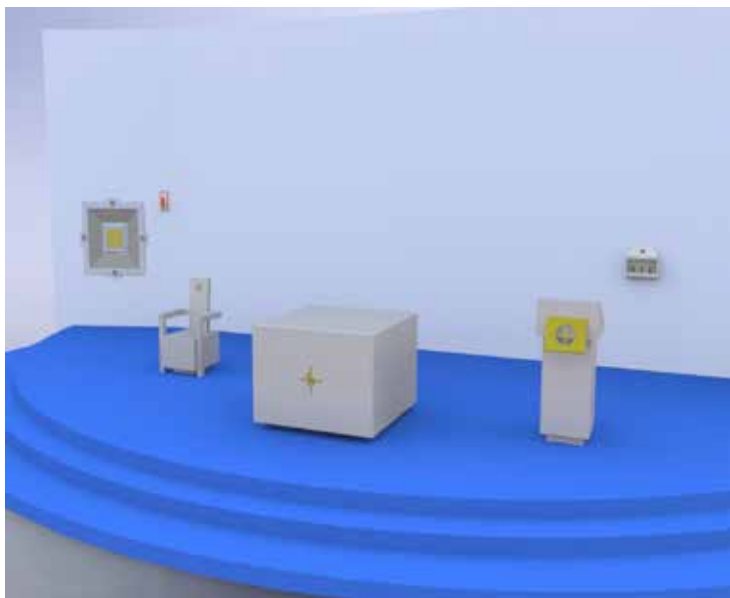

Go - make disciples

In family life, time is a scarce resource. Parents leave for work early in the morning and often return just in time to put the children to bed. They work hard all day, just to earn enough to pay the mortgage and to provide the material necessities of family life. A young mother told me not so long ago: "I seem to rush from place to place, bringing the children from one activity to another - and I'm not even sure if I am doing it for them or for me". In the midst of all the frenetic activity, many are



asking themselves where they can find time and energy to nourish their own relationship and to spend quality time with their children.

Parishes and Dioceses can be like families in that respect. Much of our energy goes into preparing and celebrating the liturgy, printing newsletters, fixing leaky

roofs, attending meetings, and filling out forms, all of which are important. Every now and then, however, we need to sit down and ask ourselves what we are actually trying to achieve and whether there might be better ways of doing it. How do the various activities in which we are engaged actually

contribute towards building community, nourishing faith and serving the mission of the Church which "exists in order to evangelise".

Historically, priests and bishops were formed to take sole responsibility for the mission of the Church. This contributed to a vision of the Church as a provider of spiritual services in which the lay faithful are recipients or consumers. Over fifty years after Vatican II, while there is undoubtedly a much greater engagement on the part of the lay faithful, the required transformation is far from complete.
