Born out of an idea, a dream and a begging bowl! - A Tribute to Sr. Ellen



Books of Condolence are available in St. Cronan's Church and BASE

On Monday morning we got the sad news that Sr. Ellen O'Donoghue, S.M.R, had gone home to God. She was laid to rest in Mount St. Oliver Cemetery in Limerick after her funeral Mass in St. Joseph's Church on Wednesday, which saw huge crowds come to pay their final respects to a mighty woman.

It was twenty nine years ago in 1987 when Sr. Ellen was appointed to Brackenstown as a Parish Sister. It wasn't long after she arrived that herself and the then Principal of the Junior School, Ann Mac Mahon, saw there was a need to provide something for young mothers whose last child had started school. In the staff room of the school they began their first personal development class and in doing so launched the vision that was to go on to become BASE.

As the second group began the following year, Sr. Ellen could see the need for a building that would let what had started grow and develop, so when a pre-fab became available things really started to get going. Over the years they did language courses, cookery, crafts, whatever people wanted to try.

As time went on and again responding to the needs of the people of the Parish, the Fingal Counselling Service began. Like with that first class in the staff room, it grew to the great service it is today and continued to develop to the needs of the Parish. The key to Sr. Ellen being able to get things done was that once she heard you had a particular skill and she put her eye on you, there was no escape. So many people were drawn in to various roles in the Parish and in BASE and so many politicians, members of the V.E.C. and others were drawn into providing facilities by her direct no-nonsense approach to things.

What many remember above all is her feistiness, her sense of fun, her ability to talk and get on with people of all ages. She had a genuine concern for people and showed immense kindness to so many. It is hard to believe that it is 17 years since she left Brackenstown, because when people speak about her, you think it was only yesterday she left, such was the impact she had on people's lives.

Fr. Paul O'Driscoll sent me these words: Sr. Ellen entered the Marie Reparatrice Sisters when they were enclosed, and after Vatican II she adapted well to the new direction of things. She was wise and compassionate, someone who it was easy to turn to in any trouble, and many did seek her help. Loyal and practical with a great sense of humour and fun. Ellen was "an encourager" helping people to blossom and brought so many good ideas to concrete reality. "A little help is worth a lot of pity" she would say. She had the freedom to be herself and the wisdom to laugh at it!

After so many years of serving the Lord in Parishes and community, may she rest in peace, for her good deeds go with her. Ar dheis Dé go raibh a hanam dhílis.

for the 1st collection at weekend

What are the benefits of such a system and how will it work?

As you may be aware, a tax scheme exists whereby those who contribute €250 or more to a charity in a given tax year can allow the charity claim an additional sum (equal to almost 45% of the donation) from the Revenue Commissioners which is sent directly to the charity concerned. St. Cronan's Parish, Brackenstown has the status of a charity for tax relief purposes. And so any donation that is given to Brackenstown Parish is classed as a charitable donation. It is important to say that there is no loss or cost incurred by any taxpayer who is willing to be part of this scheme and that confidentiality will be assured in all aspects of this process.

With an envelope system in place we can then generate possibly substantial extra revenue for our parish at no extra cost. For example a person who contributes €5 per week in the envelope system for the 1st collection, it is possible for the Parish to receive up to an extra €2.25 per week on that donation. Thank you to members of the Finance Committee for their support in this initiative.
