In September of 2015, Pope Francis extended this invitation to young people around the world: "Dear young people, at the Shrine in Krakow dedicated to the merciful Jesus, where he is depicted in the image venerated by the people of God, Jesus is waiting for you. He has confidence in you and is counting on you! He has so many things to say to each of you," the Pope continued.

"Do not be afraid to look into his eyes, full of infinite love for you. Open yourselves to his merciful gaze, so ready to forgive all your sins. A look from him can change your lives and heal the wounds of your souls. His eyes can quench the thirst that dwells deep in your young hearts, a thirst for love, for peace, for joy and for true happiness. Come to him and do not be afraid!"

The World Youth Day Pilgrimages are an extraordinary thing to experience. I have been part of three of these in Germany, Australia and Spain. Like any enriching experience it is hard to put into words what the event is like, to gather with tens of thousands of young people who are there to explore, deepen and celebrate their faith in Jesus.

It is a festival of culture, an expression in many ways, languages and shared experiences of how the good news impacts on the lives of these young people from such diverse backgrounds. I am delighted that five young people from our Parish have taken up the invitation to be part of the Dublin Pilgrimage to Krakow in July: Sarah Donohue, Stuart Donnelly, Anita Okoye, Alex Haidurov and Seán Cantwell.

They have already begun their preparation with Br. Martin and over the next few months they will link up with other pilgrims from this area and throughout the Diocese.

They need our help and support to get to Krakow and as a Parish who is fortunate enough to have young people willing to make this journey, they deserve our help. The overall cost per pilgrim is €1,000.00. Each one has to pay one third of this. The Parish will meet another third and the remainder they have to fundraise.

Next weekend you will get the opportunity to meet our pilgrims who will speak at the Masses and afterwards there will be a Church Gate Collection. Please support them.

## UCD VOLUNTEER OVERSEAS



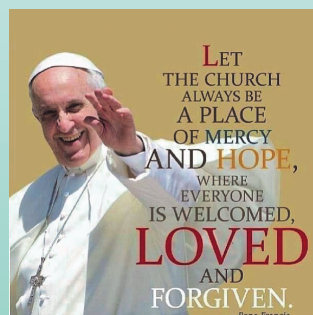
Sunday 17th January 2016

## MISERICORDIAE VULTUS - POPE FRANCIS LETTER FOR THE YEAR OF MERCY

With our eyes fixed on Jesus and his merciful gaze, we experience the love of the Most Holy Trinity. The mission Jesus received from the Father was that of revealing the mystery of divine love in its fullness. "God is love" (1 Jn 4:8,16), John affirms for the first and only time in all of Holy Scripture. This love has now been made visible and tangible in Jesus' entire life. His person is nothing but love, a love given gratuitously. The relationships he forms with the people who approach him manifest something entirely unique and unrepeatable. The signs he works, especially in favour of sinners, the poor, the marginalized, the sick, and the suffering, are all meant to teach mercy. Everything in him speaks of mercy. Nothing in him is devoid of compassion. Jesus, seeing the crowds of people who followed him, realized that they were tired and exhausted, lost and without a guide, and he felt deep compassion for them (cf. Mt 9:36). On the basis of this compassionate love he healed the sick who were presented to him (cf. Mt 14:14), and with just a few loaves of bread and fish he satisfied the enormous crowd (cf. Mt 15:37). What moved Jesus in all of these situations was nothing other than mercy,

with which he read the hearts of those with which he read the hearts of those he encountered and responded to their deepest need. When he came upon the widow of Nain taking her son out for burial, he felt great compassion for the immense suffering of this grieving mother, and he gave back her son by raising him from the dead (cf. Lk 7:15). After freeing the demoniac in the country of the Gerasenes, Jesus entrusted him with this mission: "Go home to your friends, and tell them how much the Lord has done for you, and how he has had mercy on you" (Mk 5:19). The calling of Matthew is also presented within the context of mercy. Passing by the tax collector's booth, Jesus looked intently at Matthew. It was a look full of mercy that forgave the sins of that man, a sinner and a tax collector, whom Jesus chose – against the hesitation of the disciples – to become one of the Twelve. Saint Bede the Venerable, commenting on this Gospel passage, wrote that Jesus looked upon Matthew with merciful love and chose him: *miserando atque eligendo*. This expression impressed me so much that I chose it for my episcopal motto. *Paragraph 8.*
