HARVEST THANKSGING FOOD DRIVE

"It is good to give thanks to Lord, to proclaim his help day by day" Today we give thanks to God for the food he has provided for us. We give thanks for the crops of the earth, the manufactured foods and the Fairtrade Food. In this day and age in Ireland, one in ten people is living in poverty. The very basics of life that we celebrate today are sometimes the choices they have to make between food for the family and switching on the heat.

One of the inovative responses that Crosscare have developed in co-operation with the St. Vincent de Paul Society is to open Community Food Banks, the one serving the North County is based here.
