

We will be in touch with all families who are waiting to have their child baptised when we return to Level 3 restrictions and hopefully can set some new dates for Baptisms.

- The aim of this Apostolic Letter is to increase our love for this great saint, to encourage us to implore his intercession and to imitate his virtues and his zeal.
- Each of us can discover in Joseph the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence – an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble. Saint Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation. A word of recognition and of gratitude is due to them all.
- We know that God's truth does not condemn, but instead welcomes, embraces, sustains and forgives us.
- Unless we are reconciled with our own history, we will be unable to take a single step forward, for we will always remain hostage to our expectations and the disappointments that follow.
- Jesus' appearance in our midst is a gift from the Father, which
 makes it possible for each of us to be reconciled to the flesh of our
 own history, even when we fail to understand it completely.
- I like to think that it was from Saint Joseph that Jesus drew inspiration for the parable of the prodigal son and the merciful father (cf. Lk 15:11-32).

FR. MIKHAIL NASONOV

Fr. Mikhail Nasonov is Rector of the patriarchal monastery of the Church of Holy Apostles Peter and Paul in Dublin. He was born in 1973 in Sevastopol. He studied theology in St. Petersburg and in Paris at the St. Sergius Orthodox Theological Institute. After receiving religious education he worked in the seminary in Kostroma and then taught at St. Tikhon's Theological University in Moscow. He was ordained a priest in Kostroma. Father Michael came to Ireland in April 2011 and is married with three children.

Calendar, Sacraments & Restrictions

As we begin another Level 5 restriction the only ceremonies that can take place with a congregation are Weddings (with 6 guests) and Funerals (with 10 mourners). All other ceremonies will be online only.

We have families who had booked Baptisms in 2020 who have not yet been able to celebrate this Sacrament and we will be facilitating them first before we issue dates for this year. As there is so much uncertainty what we ask you to do is email the Parish Office with your request for Baptism and include what month you would like to celebrate the Baptism. There are only ten family members with each child and a max. of four baptisms at one ceremony.

First Holy Communion and Confirmation dates will not be set until we see how restrictions continue to affect the Church being open. The Sacraments will be celebrated later than usual and there will be a restriction on numbers in the Church. This mean that half a class (50 people) or at max 1 full class (100 people) at each ceremony.
