2025 marks the 1,700 th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea which took place in AD 325. Nicaea clarified church teaching on the Trinity and the Incarnation, that God is three and yet one and that Christ is fully God and fully man. The Council gave us the Nicene Creed with language that we repeat every Sunday – that Jesus is "consubstantial" with the Father, true God from true God, begotten not made.
