PALM SUNDAY - 2ND APRIL 2023 YEAR A

Reflection We are about to enter the most solemn week in the Church's year, Holy Week,

which invites us as pilgrim people to journey with Jesus through the last days of his earthly life. Even as people of faith, how often do we stop and ask ourselves who is Jesus Christ? Who is he for me? In what way does his life and death have meaning...for me? What difference does faith in Christ make in my daily life? How do I understand resurrection? Where do I encounter the risen Christ? It is worth taking time to ponder some of these questions as we journey through Holy Week and experience the different moods and themes of the various liturgies. We begin with the jubilation marking Jesus triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. We move very quickly to the intimacy of the last Supper and the darkness of Gethsemane on Holy Thursday, the ugliness of the mock trial and crucifixion on Good Friday, the silence of Holy Saturday, and the extraordinary experience and



proclamation of resurrection on Easter Sunday. Because of what is happening in the world, or indeed in our own lives, these liturgies will speak to us in a very different way than last year or any other year. You are invited to attend as many of the liturgies as you can, and to bring someone with you. Like last year, our Good Friday outdoor stations of the cross will visit fourteen different areas of the parish. Please join us at the station which is nearest to where you live and perhaps even accompany the cross to the next station, or follow the stations live on the web. The fourteen areas are listed below in the order which the route will follow. Allow approx. 15 minutes between each station.

May our journeying together build up our faith community
