Reflection

With a conflict bringing untold suffering to civilians in the Holy Land, war continuing in Ukraine, and the increasing existential threats to humanity posed by both climate change and artificial intelligence (AI), the world can at times seem a very dark place.

This Sunday's Gospel comes as a timely reminder that the task of Christian believers is to keep the light of hope and faith alight, precisely in difficult times. We do that primarily through prayer, alone



or as a gathered community, through small but meaningful actions of solidarity with those who are suffering, such as fasting or supporting the various organisations which are bringing relief to those most in need, and through our own commitment to justice, peace-making and reconciliation. We also do it by remembering to thank God for our blessings every day. In this month of November, when we remember those in our families and in our community who have died, it is also about reaching out to those who are bereaved. As someone once said, 'it is better to light a candle than to curse the darkness'.




